We recognize that children have individual learning styles and they often need resources beyond the book to help them develop basic language skills; this is especially true for children learning English as a second language. Studies have shown that young children develop language skills by seeing objects and hearing sounds around them. They then learn to associate words with these objects and sounds. If a child sees and hears at the same time, it makes a double impression in his mind, and he's better able to remember the words.

We feel that our readalongs of a children's picture book or early chapter book extend this concept of association and imprinting. In each production, we carefully combine the book illustrations, pacing of the narration, sound effects, and music, creating a reading and listening experience that help a child develop reading and language skills.
